GCSE - What do you study:

Consists of 4 units:

1. American West – 1835-1895 – start this after Easter in yr 9.







- 2. Crime and Punishment 1000-present day
 Historic Environment Whitechapel 1870-1900 including investigating

 Jack the Ripper
- 3. Early Elizabethan England 1558-1588
- 4. Weimar and Nazi Germany 1918-1939



<u>Paper 1: Thematic study and historic environment</u> Crime and Punishment and Whitechapel case study

Written examination: 1 hour and 15 minutes 30%* of the qualification 52 marks (16 for the historic environment, 36 for the thematic study)

<u>Paper 2: Period study and British depth study</u> - American West and Early Elizabethan England

Written examination: 1 hour and 45 minutes 40%* of the qualification 64 marks (32 for the period study and 32 for the British depth study

Paper 3: Modern depth study - Weimar and Nazi Germany

Written examination: 1 hour and 20 minutes 30%* of the qualification 52 marks

Expectations – what can you expect:



Writing - there is a lot of writing – you can't get away from it. Notes, essay questions and exam practice.

Reading - same!

Analysis – students will analyse original sources from photos to newspapers to election results and decide if they are useful or not. **Students will like some bits more than others.**
