Dear Parent/Carer,

It is difficult to believe how quickly the time is passing as so many wonderful things have been happening at Christ's College. We are already into Holy Week and at the end of the spring term. I would like to take the opportunity to share a few key messages before we break up.

After the Easter break, our Year 11 students will be returning to begin their GCSE examinations. All students have their exam timetables and continue to undertake their revision in preparation for these. There are many sessions that are led by our teachers over Easter for our students to continue to be supported. We will of course also continue to run the many revision sessions in the summer term, prior to and throughout the examinations. I am sure you join me in wishing our Cohort of 2023-24 well during the next few months.

We bid farewell to two members of staff this term. Mrs Durham, our Assistant Principal and Mrs Gresz, Lead Practitioner in English, will be moving on to new challenges. I am sure you will join me in thanking them for their service to Christ's College and our best wishes for their future. Mr McGarrity will join us as Assistant Principal on 15th April 2024 and Mr Kay will join in September 2024 in the role of Lead Practitioner in English. We are looking to appoint a Finance Assistant and Higher Level Teaching Assistants. At Christ's College we dress for success to prepare for learning. We would like to thank both our students and parents/carers for supporting our uniform policy, which reflects the high standards that we, like yourself, expect. There will be one amendment to our uniform policy for <u>September</u>, which is the design of our school skirt. This will be for all new Year 7 students starting and any student who is replacing their skirt. We are not expecting parents to purchase the skirt if your child has a current school skirt that is in line with our current policy, which still fits. From September, our College skirt will have a dark blue band (to match the shirt/blouse). This smartens up our uniform further and deters students from rolling up their skirts, which is not part of our uniform policy. Unfortunately we are dealing with this on a frequent basis by a large number of students. The band should be seen in the correct position at all times. Students who opt to wear a Christ's College skirt (available through our uniform supplier), rather than our tailored trousers, are expected to wear these on or below the knee. It is recommended that when the College skirt is purchased, it falls below the knee to allow for growth. We continue to work with our uniform supplier Stevenson's, to ensure the sizing caters for all. If you experience any barriers to getting a skirt of the correct size/length, please do get in touch with sfrench@christscollege.surrey.sch.uk, who will be happy to look into this further.

Remaining on the topic of uniform, we would be grateful if you could check that your child has the full and correct uniform, without any facial piercings and/or false nails as well as the correct school shoes (details of what these should be can be found at the end of this letter), when we return after the Easter break. Often students enjoy these elements in the holidays and forget to remove them for school. This helps all students have a positive start to the term.
