## Year 11 Reports - 19th March 2025

Dear Parent/Carer

Today, Wednesday 19th March, you will be able to read your child's report on the Arbor parent portal.

We hope you find this information helpful with only a few weeks left until the majority of public examinations start. Students should now be working hard not only in school, but at home too. They have comprehensive revision plans and must attend all lessons punctually and with urgency: every minute counts in the run up to their final exams.

To access the portal either use the Arbor App or go through the online portal (<https://login.arbor.sc/>). If you have forgotten your password, you can also reset it there. If you have not used the Arbor portal before, you have been emailed an invitation to sign up (please check your junk or spam folder).

There is a lot of detail on the report, as follows:

- **Attendance/Lates:** Attendance and punctuality are important for a student's attainment levels and positive attitude towards College life. Students should aim for 100% attendance and avoid broken weeks (i.e. taking the odd day off).
- **Behaviour Incidents:** This is a count of any cautions (negative behaviour incidents) given this term. We do not record positive behaviour points, but rather House Points.
- **House Points:** House points are awarded to students for demonstrating the core values in school.
- **Current Mark (Attainment Grade):** For Year 11 this is their recent February Mock Exam result, based on the 2024 paper and grade boundaries. These are colour coded as follows: pale green shows on target, darker green shows above target and cream shows below target, for your child's minimum expected attainment grades.
- **Minimum Target Grade:** For each subject, a student has a minimum target grade. This is calculated using the Department for Education's attainment 8 estimates.

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- **Attitude to Learning, Conduct and Homework Grades:** Each subject has reported judgements for attitude to learning in class, conduct in class and homework. Remember, the higher the number the better the judgement:

4 = excellent      3= good      2= requires improvement      3=cause for concern
